**Entry Closing Date:** Monday, September 26

**Entry Fee:** \$60 per entry  
*(Exception: Group Classes have no entry fee – Beef Only)*

**Late Entry Fee:** \$250.00 per entry – the late entry fee will apply to all entries after September 26 and will be enforced by the Agriculture Show Office.  
No entry fee in Breeders Herd, Junior Get of Sire, Get of Sire, Progeny of Dam, Two Bulls Bred and Owned, Best Pair of Females and Best Pair Both Sexes

**Tie-Out Fee:** included in the Entry Fee

**Blocking Chute Fee:** \$38

### Note:

1. Contact your Breed Barn Boss for move in times.
2. Tie-Outs will NOT be available until Sunday, October 30, 12:00 pm.
3. Individual breeder or farm display space will NOT be allowed in the barn.
4. For safety reasons a single leadsman can only handle a maximum of 2 animals at one time.

### Rules and Regulations

1. For safety and environmental reasons, GLASS BOTTLES ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE BARNs.
2. **\*NEW\*** The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair has banned the use of aerosol cans in the Marshalling area. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.

3. This show (sections 300-312) is recognized as a purebred show and as such, registrations will be governed by Livestock Rules and Regulations Rule 3.
4. There shall be no limit on the number of entries that may be made by an exhibitor. Notwithstanding this provision the maximum number of animals and groups that may be shown by an exhibitor shall be as follows:
  - a. In Classes for single animals there is no restriction on the number of animals shown by an exhibitor.
  - b. In Classes for groups - one group.
  - c. The maximum number of animals of one breed that an exhibitor may bring to the show in Classes for single animals is 16 for all breeds.
5. A breeding unit may show 2 additional exhibits provided these are 4-H animals shown by 4-H members. These exhibits will not be eligible to compete in the Breeders Herd and Get of Sire Class.
6. **There will be a MINIMUM 40 animals SHOWN in any beef breed show. The RAWF reserves the right to cancel a show if insufficient entries are received by the entry deadline.**
  - a. **The cow/calf classes are considered one animal entry as the cow/calf must be shown as a single unit to be eligible for placement by the judge.**
  - b. **If a breed does not show the minimum number, that breed will be placed on probation for one year. If that breed does not reach the minimum number of animals shown during the probation year, the association will not be requested to appoint breed representatives for the following year's Beef Cattle Committee and the show will be cancelled.**
7. At the time of making entry the following information must be given with respect to each animal entered including calves with cows:
  - a. Name and registration number
  - b. Tattoo number (MUST BE LEGIBLE)
  - c. Date of birth
  - d. Name of sire and dam
  - e. All calves must be entered on the Entry Form along with their dams including calves with cows
  - f. Entered in the name of the registered owner(s)

**NOTE: The entry fee is for making the entry ONLY. It is not a stall fee and does not guarantee stall space. You will be allocated space based on the number of animals you bring to the show.**

8. No animal may be shown in more than one Class for single animals except championships, special prizes or groups. To be eligible for showing in a group Class, every member of the group must have been exhibited in its appropriate Class for single animals. Calves shown in single Classes will not be allowed to be shown in a single Class with their dam, unless otherwise stated in the individual Breed Section.
9. The original registration certificates of all entries must accompany cattle to the show and must be checked by an official of the Breed Association concerned.
10. **Ear tagging and animal identification must be in compliance with mandatory traceability rules and regulations of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada.**
11. Requirement for entry in Classes for breeding animals: All calves and yearlings must be weighed at the show prior to showing with their birth date, show weight, and weight per day of age posted in the stall. All other entries must be weighed with their weight posted. (at breeds discretion and decision)
12. Substitutions will be allowed, as follows:
  - a. 2 substitutions within breed per exhibitor.
  - b. If a change of ownership occurs to an animal entered in the RAWF after the entry closing date and a copy of the transferred registration paper is presented to the RAWF Agriculture Show Office prior to the printing of the catalogue the

new owner will be credited as the exhibitor.

- c. Substitutions must be made with the Agriculture Show Office staff upon arrival.
13. A joint ownership entry must be made on a separate Entry Form, the entry must be registered under the names of the owners. In the event that one of the joint owners is the breeder of the animal he may include it in his exhibit in the group Class having a "bred by" requirement.
14. An exhibitor is not required to list the names and numbers of the animals comprising a herd or group at the time of making entry, but must give such information to the official of the breed association concerned with the checking of registration certificates before the commencement of the judging of the herd or group.
15. Provision has been made whereby the RAWF will supply an area for tying out beef cattle at night, between the hours of 5:30 pm and 7:00 am. Cattle will be allowed in the designated area only. All tie-outs are included in the entry fee, on the Entry Form. No first bedding will be provided.
16. Any animal not properly controlled by a nose lead or some other method will be barred from showing.
17. In an effort to improve the traffic flow the following restrictions have been placed on the number of blocking chutes that an exhibitor may bring to the RAWF:
  - a. less than 3 head stabled - no chute
  - b. 3 - 6 head stabled - 1 chute
  - c. 7 or more head stabled - 2 chutes
  - d. Chute tags can be purchased on entry form. All chutes must have tag attached to a visible bar.
  - e. Chutes must be placed in an area as directed by Beef Cattle Superintendent.
  - f. Chutes will not be provided by the RAWF.
18. Blocking chutes found in the barn that have not been paid for or not located in a designated area will be charged a fee of \$100.00 per chute and impounded.
19. A standard amount of a first bedding pack of wood bark will be provided for Beef Cattle. NO STRAW WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BEEF BARN. Shavings may be used at the owner's expense. Straw will ONLY be allowed for tie-outs.
20. No butt fans. Only overhead side mounted fans will be allowed.
21. A maximum of 1 head fan per 5 animals will be permitted.
22. All exhibitors are requested to show in dress approved by the breed association while showing animals in the ring. Such apparel shall not bear any letters, marks or labels purporting to reveal the identity of the exhibitor.
23. All animals must be identified in the show ring by numbers only displayed on the backs of the exhibitors. In order that these numbers may be displayed properly, a special harness is necessary. The numbers will be supplied at no cost to the exhibitor. No ear tags which identify the exhibitor will be allowed.
24. The following criteria will be used to determine the winners of the Premier Exhibitor and the Premier Breeder Awards for each beef breed (sec. 300 - 312):

**Premier Exhibitor Award:** An award is presented to the breeding unit (exhibitor) with the most points for animals owned and shown by the breeding unit based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. All animals accumulating points for this award must be the entries of one breeding unit. A breeding unit (exhibitor) is defined as "that person whose name appears on the Certificate of Registration as owner or partner, who pays the entry fee, and has the animal in their show string."

Points shall be awarded as follows:

1st – 7 2nd – 6 3rd – 5 4th – 4 5th – 3 6th – 2 7th – 1

To be eligible for this award the exhibitor must have entered and shown in a minimum of five single Classes.

**Premier Breeder Award:** An award is presented to the individual or company (as recorded on the Certificate of Registration) whose animals accumulate the highest total points based

on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award, the breeder must exhibit at the show. Qualification for this award is based on Canadian rules that specify all owners at the time of conception are the breeders of the animals.

Points will be awarded as follows:

1st – 7 2nd – 6 3rd – 5 4th – 4 5th – 3 6th – 2 7th – 1

To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award the Breeder must exhibit at the show. In the event of a tie for the Premier Breeder Award, the Award shall go to whichever breeder that is tied for the Award that places highest in the Breeder's Herd.

**Note:**

1. There must be a minimum of 13 animals exhibited in a class before it will be split.
2. Classes will be split in multiples of 12. (i.e. 1-12, 13-24, 25-36, 37-48, etc.)

**ENTERING ON-LINE**

1. ENTER the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair website: [www.royalfair.org](http://www.royalfair.org)
2. Under the Competitors, Exhibitors & Trade tab, a drop down menu from the "Agriculture Show Competitors" with the option to click on 'Enter On-Line. You will also find in that menu the competition book, individual breed sections, and the entry forms. Once you have entered the correct information onto the entry forms, with your payment information, submit your entry.
3. You should receive an instant confirmation notice that your entries have been received.
