Class 6 – Junior Champion Female and Reserve..... Banner
Class 7 – Female, born in 2009, with her own 2011, natural purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Female and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeder’s Herd and Get of Sire only 10 Rosettes
Class 8 – Female, born prior to January 1, 2009, with her own 2011, natural purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Female and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeder’s Herd and Get of Sire only 10 Rosettes

Class 20 – Breeder’s Herd – A group of four (4) animals bred by the exhibitor, both sexes represented, must be exhibited in previous classes. One animal must be owned by the exhibitor.....	5 Rosettes
Class 21 – Get of Sire – A group of three (3) animals from the same sire, both sexes represented, must be exhibited in previous classes. One animal must be owned by the exhibitor.....	5 Rosettes
Class 22 – Progeny of Dam – Two (2) animals, either sex, the progeny of one dam, must be exhibited in previous classes. One animal must be owned by the exhibitor	5 Rosettes

Specials

Premier Exhibitor Award: An award is presented to the breeding unit (exhibitor) with the most points for animals owned and shown by the breeding unit based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. All animals accumulating points for this award must be the entries of one breeding unit. A breeding unit (exhibitor) is defined as ‘that person whose name appears on the Certificate of Registration as owner or partner, who pays the entry fee, and has the animal in their show string.

Premier Breeder Award: An award is presented to the individual or company (as recorded on the Certificate of Registration) whose animals accumulate the highest total points based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award, the breeder must exhibit at the show. Qualification for this award is based on Canadian rules that specify all owners at the time of conception are the breeders of the animals.

Don Turnbull Achievement Award: An award is presented to an individual or company that best exemplifies Don Turnbull’s integrity, exemplary animal husbandry and his dedication to the Charolais breed. To be eligible for this honor the breeder must exhibit at the show. Nominations and voting is conducted by fellow exhibitors. The Don Turnbull Achievement Award is presented at the commencement of the Charolais Show.
