Rules and Regulations

1. The Rabbit and Cavy Show is an Open Show and will be judged according to the most recent Dominion Rabbit and Cavy Breeders Association Standard of Perfection.
2. In Classes for any other colour (A.O.C.), colour must be listed on the entry form. In Classes for any other standard breed (A.O.S.B.), breed must be listed on the entry form.
3. No limit on the number of entries that the exhibitor may show in open classes.
4. A Limit of three entries per exhibitor may be shown in any Claiming Class (Ex. Fryer Class).
5. Exhibitors should be prepared to have animals remain in carriers.
6. Arrival time: 7:45 a.m. on Sunday, November 13.
7. ONLY PROPERLY ENTERED ANIMALS WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE SHOW. NO SELLING OF ANIMALS NOT ENTERED IN THE SHOW.
8. No exhibit may be removed until Sunday, November 13 6:00 p.m. and must be removed no later than Sunday, November 13 - 8:00 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS.
9. Rabbits and Cavies showing evidence of being unhealthy or diseased may be removed from the building at the discretion of the Superintendent.
10. PASSES: Every exhibitor who makes entries in classes listed in this prize list that pays entry fees in the amount of \$20.00 or more is entitled to one pass. This will be mailed to the exhibitor with an acknowledgement of his/her entries. This pass provides entrance for all 10 days. Youth/4-H club members & Pet Exhibitors will automatically receive an admission card in their confirmation of entries.
11. Substitutions between rabbit and cavy breeds will not be allowed on show day. Substitutions within the breed only, will be allowed. (Example: An exhibitor cannot substitute an American Sable for an Angora English).

Claiming Classes (Fryer Class and Breeders Herd)

The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair is committed to provide marketing support to exhibitors to explore revenue opportunities. In addition to all the usual classes, we've borrowed an idea from the Thoroughbred and Standardbred horse people and will be offering three "Claiming Classes" this year.

For the 2011 show, exhibits in 1521 – Commercial Fryer Class, 1522 – Breeders Herd (Black or White or combination of Black and White) and 1523 – Breeders Herd (Other than Black or white or combination of Black and white) will be available for claiming on judging day, November 13, 2011. Exhibitors enter these classes with the understanding that their animals may be claimed. No substitutions or changes of any kind will be allowed.

At the conclusion of judging, these exhibits will be offered for sale (claiming) by way of silent auction. At 2:00pm the bidding will close and sale will be to the highest bidder. Settlement of sale will be by cash by 2:30. Judging placement will accompany the exhibits.

Starting bid for single commercial fryer: \$30.00

Starting bid for Breeders Herd: \$125.00

All entries in these classes will be displayed in a separate area and carriers must house only animals entered in the single fryer and breeders herd.

Skein Competition

(Sections 1700-1704)

1. Weight of skeins should be approximately 1 ounce, except Section 1700 Class 1 which should be ½ ounce.
2. All skeins must be handspun and at least 50% angora. Skeins should be tied securely in at least 4 places with matching yarn.
3. Entries must include description and end use (what you plan to make with this yarn – this is very Important). Description should include: colour, weight, plies, special technique, fiber other than ANGORA, approximate percentages etc.,

 2. Two-Ply: fine, medium or bulky
 3. Other ply or novelty
