Fence lines and rock piles make great _____ for the threatened Black Rat Snake.

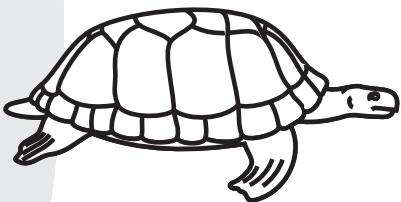
The _____ is an expert digger. This endangered mammal lives in farm areas and uses its powerful claws to make borrows and dig for food.
