#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

**Attention US Exhibitors:** Please refer to the Livestock Rules for Import Permit Process and Testing Requirements.

**Standard Agreement Form:** All exhibitors must read and acknowledge they understand the Dairy Cattle Code of Ethics by signing the entry form. Entries will not be processed if the Standard Agreement Between Owners and Fitters for Dairy Shows section is not signed.

Changing the natural colour of an animal is prohibited. However, external applications of cosmetics that affect only appearance may be used, including by way of example colour touch up of a maximum of 4" on either side of the topline, hoof polishes and false switches.


