EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE

- 1. Any Shorthorn shown at the RAWF is subject to parentage tests and/or mouthing. Tests will be supervised by the Show Committee of the Ontario Shorthorn Association. In the event that the veterinarian determines that the animal's age is incorrect, that animal will be barred from showing. All cattle must have Canadian Papers to be shown at the RAWF.
- 2. ALL CATTLE ENTERED MUST BE REGISTERED PRIOR TO MAKING ENTRIES TO THE RAWF (entries with "registration applied for" will not be accepted).
- 3. Exhibitor Attire: All must wear the designated burgundy show shirts while showing. Shirts are available for

purchase at a cost of \$40 per shirt. They are available in mens and womens sizes. Please order IN ADVANCE from the Ontario Shorthorn Association through Doug Brown (905) 431-8496 or email douglassbrown@ rogers.com. - 4. To be eligible to show, males must be at least 93.8% pure and females must be at least 87.5% pure (except in class 1, 2 & 15).
- 5. The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair has banned the use of aerosol cans in the marshalling area as per General Beef Rule #2. Failure to comply with this will result in disqualification.

Class 1 Shorthorn Plus Heifers, born in 2022, min. 3 months of age on day of judging

Winner of this class will not be included in the Division or overall Champion classes.

Class 2 Shorthorn Plus Yearling Female born in 2021

Heifers between 50 and 87.4 percentage pure blood Shorthorn.

Winner of this class will not be included in the Division or overall Champion classes.

Class 3 Heifer Calf, born in 2022, min. 3 months of age on day of judging*

Class 3 will be divided into Senior, Intermediate and Junior divisions as follows:

Junior - March 16 and younger Intermediate - Feb 1 to March 15 Senior - Jan 1 to Jan 31

Class 11 Female, born in 2020, with her own 2022, natural purebred, tattooed calf at foot

Female and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeders' Herd and Get of Sire only Rosettes

Calf information must be written on the entry form

Class 12 Female, born prior to 2020, with her own 2022, natural purebred, tattooed calf at foot

Female and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Breeder's Herd and Get of Sire Rosettes

Calf information must be written on the entry form.

Class 13 Senior Female, Champion and Reserve Rosettes

Class 14 Grand Champion Female and Reserve Rosettes

Class 15 Shorthorn Plus Bull Calf, born in the 2022 year

Calves between 50 and 93.7 percentage pure blood Shorthorn. Winner of this class will not be included in the Division or overall Champion classes

*OSA show committee will have final say on class splits and reserves the right to make minor adjustments to the divisions.

Class 16 Bull Calf, born in 2022, min. 3 months of age on day of judging*

SPECIALS

Premier Exhibitor Award

An award is presented to the exhibitor with the most points for animals owned and shown by the exhibitor based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. All animals accumulating points for this award must be the entries of one exhibitor. In the case of a joint ownership, the exhibitor must be specified, otherwise the joint owners will be considered as one exhibitor/entity. Banner presented by The Royal Winter Agricultural Fair.

Premier Breeder Award

An award is presented to the individual or company (as recorded on the Certificate of Registration) whose animals accumulate the highest total points based on their highest six (6) placings in the individual classes. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award, the breeder must exhibit at the show. Qualification for this award is based on Canadian rules that specify all owners at the time of conception are the breeders of the animals. Banner presented by The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair.

Redford W. Gardhouse Memorial Trophy

Presented by the Gardhouse family to the exhibitor of the winning Breeder's Herd. Redford Gardhouse was the President of the Ontario and Canadian Shorthorn Association and The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair.Bennett Trophy (Perpetual) Presented to the owner of the Grand Champion Bull in memory of Mr. & Mrs. S.G. Bennett, recognizing their contribution towards the Shorthorn breed.

Stewart Boyd Memorial Trophy

Presented to the Junior Female Champion by Mrs. Suzanne Boyd and family, Michael and Debbie in memory of the late Stewart Boyd. The Harold R. White Trophy (Perpetual) Presented to the Grand Champion Female by The Canadian Shorthorn Association in recognition of the contribution to the Shorthorn breed by the late Mr. White. A memento will be presented to the winner.

The Will A. Dryden Memorial Trophy (Perpetual)

Presented to the exhibitor of the winning Get of Sire by Mrs. Margaret Dryden to honour the memory of her husband, the late Will A. Dryden. Mr. Dryden was a charter member of the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, its first president from 1919 to 1923, managing director from 1936 to 1949 and a member of the executive committee from the commencement of the RAWF in 1922 until his death in 1949. A memento will be presented to the winner.

Shorthorn Championship Trophy (Perpetual)

Presented to the exhibitor of the Best Shorthorn of the show by the Shorthorn Society of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.




